Nature of support in 2015 / 2016

1. To ensure 'quality first' teaching

No amount of interventions can override the fundamental condition that PP children must have the best possible experience within their classroom with their class teacher. Therefore, funding has been used to ensure all staff, both teachers and teaching assistants, participate in CPD externally and within school to ensure class teaching is of the highest standard possible. We also use PPG to fund Abacus and Wordsmith which aids the teaching of English and maths in a fun way as well as giving the teachers the tools to monitor and assess the progress of all children including those receiving PPG.

2. Specific Interventions

With 'quality first teaching' in place, specific interventions are employed to enable pupils to make greater progress. These interventions must be of high quality and target gaps in PP children's learning so they are truly effective otherwise a PP child is better off staying in the classroom. We deployed teachers and teaching assistants to enhance pupils' opportunities to make academic progress. Interventions included maths and literacy; individual reading; nurture groups; daily handwriting; fine motor control; gross motor control and speech and language.

Each class had additional TA time to personalise intervention. We also employ an ELSA.

3. Parental Support

Phonics, reading and writing workshops were delivered to help parents to support their children at home.

4. Enrichment and Enhancement

To enhance the engagement of PP children, the school subsidises extracurricular activities so PPG is used for music tuition and to aid trips including residential.

5. To ensure 'quality first' teaching

No amount of interventions can override the fundamental condition that PP children must have the best possible experience within their classroom with their class teacher. Therefore, funding will be used to ensure all staff, both teachers and teaching assistants, participate in CPD externally and within school to ensure class teaching is of the highest standard possible. We will also use PPG to continue to fund Abacus (Maths) and Wordsmith which teaches English in a fun way as well as giving the teachers the tools to monitor and assess the progress of all children including those receiving PPG. We will also invest in Clicker 7 which is a useful tool for pupils who need additional support in English as well as a fantastic teaching tool. We are also looking to fund digital technology that supports learning or encourages parental involvement.

6. Specific Interventions

With 'quality first' teaching in place, specific interventions will continue including: maths and literacy; individual reading; nurture groups; daily handwriting; fine motor control; gross motor control and speech and language. We will deploy teachers and teaching assistants to enhance pupils' opportunities to make academic progress. We have recruited an additional full time teacher so pupils get the best possible teaching across the curriculum.

Each class will continue additional TA time to personalise intervention.

7. Parental Support

Maths and phonics, reading and writing workshops will be delivered to help parents to support their children at home.

8. Enrichment and Enhancement

To enhance the engagement of Pupil Premium children, the school will continue to subsidise extracurricular activities so PPG will be used for visits to Greatwood Horsepower Centre, music tuition and to aid trips including residential. It will also be used to enable PPG pupils to attend Chilton Child Care After School Club.
