Pupil Premium Statement

The Pupil Premium is an allocation of additional funding provided to schools to support specific groups of children who are vulnerable to possible underachievement. These include pupils who have been entitled to free school meals at any point in the past six years, those looked after by the Local Authority and the children of armed service personnel.

It is important that those who are eligible for Free School Meals claim them as this leads to important financial benefits for the school. Your child may be eligible for free school meals if you receive:

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on'
- Universal Credit

To receive free school meals an application form is available from the Wiltshire Council website. www.wiltshire.gov.uk

All schools are required to report on the amount of funding received and how this is being used. Each school can decide how the money is best spent to benefit their eligible pupils.

The Pupil Premium funding can be used as follows:

- Additional time with a teaching assistant in class, either individually or as part of a group, in order to provide support to make the expected progress in their learning.
- Participation in intervention programmes out of class, organised by the Head Teacher, e.g. spelling, reading, social skills.
- To provide one-to-one tuition for some pupils.
- To provide experiences and enrichment activities in order to broaden horizons and provide access to the whole curriculum, e.g. residential visits, theatre trips, music lessons.
- Extra support to facilitate emotional development and build confidence and self-esteem.
- Extra learning resources and training to support the delivery of intervention programmes.

The progress and attainment for individual children that are part of this group is tracked and monitored carefully to ensure they achieve their full potential.

At the October 2013 pupil census the percentage of children who are eligible for Pupil Premium at Chilton Foliat is 13%.

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This year the school will receive £15,600 money as a Pupil Premium grant and plans to spend the money as follows:

- Parent Support Advisors
- Additional support for writing in the form of intervention programmes out of class
- Supporting emotionally vulnerable children
- Use of Abacus as a Maths tool

Last academic year the money was spent on piano, French and football tuition plus school trips. The impact of spending for 2013-14 on attainment, progress and other areas will be provided at the end of the academic year. We anticipate that this funding will help assist targeted children to make expected progress over the academic year. Progress is reviewed periodically at the Governing Body's Standards Committee

This Pupil Premium Statement will be reviewed annually.
