The children are preparing for their harvest service, which is going to take place on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> October 2019 at 2.00pm at St Mary's Church, Chilton Foliat. **All are welcome.** Songs, prayers and readings will be shared to celebrate the wonder of autumn, one of God's amazing creations. ### Trussell Trust Swindon Food Bank

Donations can be brought into school from the week beginning Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October and they will be collected and delivered to the Food Bank, on or around the time of the Harvest Service.

It was a great success and seeing the children help and support each other while both on and off the pitch was wonderful. There was wonderful sportsmanship all around with many of the older children assisting the younger ones. Overall, 44 of our junior children decided to take part in at least one match! That's an incredible number but one that we can still try to top next year.

Special thanks to all school House Captains for both their help on the day and beforehand when organising the teams.

There had to be a winner of course although it was very close. Both Kennet and Littlecote scored the same number of points, but because of scoring more goals, it meant that this year the football champions were **Littlecote**.



### Attendance

We are pleased to say that our attendance figures for the beginning of this academic are at 97.27% and that we are receiving less requests for absences which unfortunately cannot be authorised. This is good news and we are grateful for all your support and forward planning. We do know, that extended absence has a well evidenced negative impact on learning and achievement and this is something, as a whole school community, we work towards avoiding. The Local Authority have sent reminders out to all schools that their Educational Welfare Officers will be conducting regular register checks and questioning whether, in the event of 10 or more sessions of unauthorised absence, a penalty notice has been issued. ### Reading

As I'm sure you all know, reading at home is probably the single most important thing a parent can do to support their child's education. It is proven to make a real difference to educational outcomes.

We are extremely proud of the importance our families place on reading with their children, from reception all the way up to Year 6, on a regular basis. We are grateful to all our families who read both with and to their child (ren) every day, ask questions about what is being read and then sign reading records so that we can keep track of reading achievement in school. We love to celebrate reading achievements in class and as part of Celebration Assembly.

I am therefore delighted to tell you that reading is going to form a central part of our school development plan over the coming year. As English Lead, Mrs Pinnegar is driving new initiatives to continue to promote our love of reading: from suggesting recommended, high quality reading books, relevant to age and stage which build up vocabulary and writing ability; making links with our local Hungerford Book Shop (more information to follow); inviting guest authors to school, to project managing a new library facility in school. Mrs Gibson and Mrs Jepson are developing a refreshed phonics programme of learning and we have invested in a new stock of fully decodable phonics reading books and guided reading for our younger children. More information will be sent out over the next few weeks and months which will describe in more detail the implementation and impact of our reading initiatives, however, on behalf of the whole school team, I would like to thank you for your continued reading support at home.

### Messy Church

Now that we have our wonderful new club house, we are keen to promote its use for the benefit of the whole community. There are several ideas in the pipeline and one of which is to launch a regular Messy Church event, more than likely on a Saturday afternoon once every half term. Messy Church is an opportunity for families to gather who perhaps have not found other forms of church engaging or who don't yet belong to a church. It is really child friendly and child engaging. It explores a biblical theme through hands-on creative experiences, a celebration and refreshments. The Messy Church organisers, parent, Mrs Bleasdale and our very own MDSA and Chilton Child Club Leader, Mrs Stewart-Smythe are looking for volunteers to help support this initiative and would like to hold a "get to know more about meeting" in the club house on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> November at 2.00pm.
