



Dear Parents and Carers of Year 5 & 6 children

Please see below an outline of the Year 5 & 6 Home Learning provision programme which is planned out for the weeks beginning, Monday 23rd March 2020 and Monday 30th March 2020.

In order to make access to the learning activities more manageable, the school will post information on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, by 10.00am for the two weeks leading up to the Easter holiday.

1. Reading Comprehension - 30 minutes
2. Writing Task - 30 minutes
3. Spelling Mat Activity from the Statutory Word List x 2 per day - 20 minutes altogether
4. Maths Activity – 40 minutes
5. Timetable activity/game - 10 minutes
6. Project work (outlined below) – 60 minutes

The tasks above equate to the approximate amount of time spent completing activities during a normal school day.

- Answers have been attached for most of the activities so parents and children can mark these together each day.

The activities can both be printed and filled in, or answers recorded in the exercise books provided. If work is to be completed in books, then please make it very clear which work is completed by giving each piece the relevant title, date and possible page number. Although work is completed at home, we will be expecting all work completed to a high standard and handed in when the children return to school.

This project will be carried out each afternoon from Monday to Friday. After you have completed all the tasks you will combine your homework and make it into a project/booklet. You will then share your findings with our class. Your project is based on the Maya Civilisation. You will be finding information from secondary sources of information. Take a look at the following guide to help you complete your project. Ensure you spread the workload over the course each afternoon, so you can produce a high-quality product by the time you return to school. Your project will need to include:

- A front cover (title and your name)
- Contents and index page, possibly a glossary
- 5 pieces of work (see below for details)
- Photographs and illustrations Suggestions for each week (only a guide):
 - An introductory page that orients the reader about the project
 - Research an area of interest such as: school, home life, clothing, music or religion. Find information about this chosen area and write out what you have learnt (in your own words please)
 - Sketch an artefact from the Maya civilization. Annotate around the artefact sketch what you believe it tells you about their way of life/society
 - Research Mayan art and make your own Mayan art piece.
 - Make your own Mayan mask or pyramid
 - Interesting facts – facts that you have found that you think no-one else will have found
 - Where in the world the Maya civilization was located (a map would be great here!)

Your project will need to have a combination of typed and hand-written work. Remember to keep your work clear, informative and well presented. It should be visual and interesting for the person reading it. We look forward to seeing your project!
