

## Home School Learning – Feedback and Future Development

We are delighted to have received such positive feedback via [talktomrturner@chiltonfoliat.wilts.sch.uk](mailto:talktomrturner@chiltonfoliat.wilts.sch.uk) and teacher phone-calls home about our home school learning provision. Whilst how we deliver the content, varies across the school, feedback on what is going well includes:

- ◆ The way the content is structured, it's easy to dip in and out of especially when there is more than one child at home and adults have work commitments
- ◆ There is a mix of online instruction with clear modelling of images and audio to match the picture/written explanation
- ◆ A good mix of written or recorded activity with practical activity
- ◆ That any new learning is related to what has been learnt before
- ◆ Questions can be asked and answered during the day about the work that has been set (in the majority) if any clarity around the learning instruction is needed. The way to do this is through [talktomrturner@chiltonfoliat.wilts.sch.uk](mailto:talktomrturner@chiltonfoliat.wilts.sch.uk)
- ◆ Teachers are also able to provide feedback and comments on work done if parents are able to send in examples via the **talktomrturner** email address: [talktomrturner@chiltonfoliat.wilts.sch.uk](mailto:talktomrturner@chiltonfoliat.wilts.sch.uk)
- ◆ There are also informal network groups amongst some parents who are also able to check in with each other and see results of work produced.

We have also received one or two questions about the possibility of providing teacher lead online learning or streaming of lessons. As you can imagine there has been a huge amount of discussion and sharing of ideas within the profession about how to use technology to provide home learning and to keep connected with all our families. There has been a plethora of guidance available from many quarters and what feels like an equal amount of quick fix solutions from various tech platforms, of the "all you have to do is press this button" variety. Based on experience, this is hardly ever the case. We have analysed and evaluated much of this information and applied to our school context and have found that currently we are meeting many, if not all, of the shared expectations that home school learning should be providing.

## Returning to School

We all know that there is growing speculation about how and when children will be coming back to school. We are keeping abreast of information as it becomes available. No decisions will be made until we are fully aware of the final Government Guidance and advice from our Local Authority.


