Local School's Nature Grant Success

We are delighted that Mrs Gibson has been successful in her bid application to Learning Through Landscapes, a leading UK charity, dedicated to enhancing outdoor learning and play for children. The grant that has been awarded comes in two parts. The provision of some fantastic outdoor equipment: a bug hotel, a wildlife camera and a den building kit and some free training for staff and volunteers on how to use our school grounds to support biodiversity.

Revd. Sue's Harvest Communication

"The churches' plan is to celebrate Harvest over the next month, focusing on Creation and humanity working in harmony with God to care for creation and bring in the harvest:

- There will be a special harvest-themed Team service on the 27th September in Ramsbury, also a phone-in service on the same theme at 11.30.
 - A pre-recorded reflection on "We plough the fields..." will be on our website and Facebook
 - Letters are going to out organisations in Aldbourne as they usually do for the Harvest Appeal for the Swindon Food Collective; there will be baskets - as always – in ALL the church porches; other villages may like to piggyback on this appeal
 - We're encouraging people, especially families, to make or draw a scarecrow out of something that would otherwise be thrown away, put it in a window or garden, and upload a pic to our Facebook page
- On the 24th October, the celebration will climax in a Gift Day at St Michael's Aldbourne – there will be someone there to receive gifts in cash or kind, the Food Collective will be represented, and we'll finish with a short Community Harvest Service at 3.45pm (Anglican/Methodist)."
