Coordinating Conjunctions are used in the middle of a sentence to join two independent clauses.

You can remember which words are **coordinating conjunctions** using the handy mnemonic 'F.A.N.B.O.Y.S.'

F – for
A – and
N – nor
B – but
O – or
Y – yet
S – so
