Looking for that light at the end of the tunnel, after what has been a challenging time for all, we look forward to planning for September. After the next set of Government guidance has been released, we will be able to make our plans and communicate them to you. It is our understanding that schools across England will be open to all year groups from the beginning of the new academic year. However, it is also our understanding that measures will still be in place to keep our children and our staff well protected from the transmission and spread of COVID-19 Coronavirus. Once the guidance has been released and our Local Authority has reviewed it with a view to issuing further advice to all LA educational settings, schools will then be able to develop their plans according to their own contexts. As soon as I am able I will share our plans with the whole school community. Once again and on behalf of the whole school teaching team, I would like to thank you for your continued support of your children's home-school learning and educational well-being.

Welcome to a new member of staff

We are delighted to share the good news that the school has successfully appointed Mr Hughes's replacement for Muntjac Class. Miss Charlotte Black will be joining the Chilton Foliat teaching team from 1st September 2020. Class Structures

Once we have the new Government guidance and our opening plans for September, we will also be able to describe how we plan to manage transition into new classes for all our children.

Microsoft Teams

Now that we are up and running with Microsoft Teams using it to “chat”, keep in touch and present French lessons courtesy of Madame Sophie, we are able to share a set of guidelines for safe and effective use. In terms of policy the school has permission to use Microsoft Teams as per our Data Protection Policy and E-Safety Policy (including Use of Internet and Digital Technology). I have also consulted our Designated Data Protection Officer (DDPO) with regard to GDPR compliance. I will continue to liaise with our DDPO in relation to any additions to policy that may be required as we continue to pursue options for online learning that require audio/video capability.

- Every session or presentation is recorded for safeguarding purposes
- It is good practice for parents to be involved and/or at hand whilst sessions are being presented
- Children are asked to dress appropriately and behave as if they were taking part in a normal school lesson (for example, no eating and making sure they are focusing on the presentation)
- Backgrounds should be kept as plain as possible and it is strongly advised the children do not take part in a session whilst in a bedroom or room isolated from parental supervision.
- Please wait to be invited to join your session by your teacher
- Whilst presentations will be recorded, they will not be streamed. Originally, we had decided to stream sessions so that they would be available to watch by children who were unable to attend live. However, we do have some families who have not given permission to use photographic images (which we wholeheartedly support) and would rather they had the opportunity to attend the session live and not be discouraged in taking part at all.
- Only the Owner of a recording (a teacher) has access to a recording.
- All Owners and Members must keep their log in details: email address and password private, they must not be shared
- Only Team Owners and Team Members have access to their Team (by using their log in details) and cannot join any other Team.

It is great to see so many of our children log in for their French lessons with Madame Sophie and engage so proactively and we are very grateful to Madame Sophie for juggling her very busy schedule to accommodate us. Merci Beaucoup!
