Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back to Autumn Term 2 and we hope you have had a restful and happy half-term break. The first term for any new school year is always very busy and very tiring for our children: getting back into the school routine for most, getting used to it for the first time for some. The good news is that we have all come back looking refreshed and ready to enjoy what our second term has to offer – which is a lot!

Covid-19 Update

By the end of last term, Wiltshire reported an increase of positive Covid cases well in excess of the national average. Case rates in the 10 to 14-year age group were particularly high. In addition, many schools experienced staff shortages as a result of positive Covid testing and winter illnesses. In response, our Wiltshire Local Authority public health colleagues recommended a particular focus on the four following areas for the remainder of the term and for 14 days post half term whilst case numbers are reviewed.

1. Halt 'whole school' assemblies for the time being and any other 'large gatherings and mixing'

2. Introduce face coverings in communal areas such as corridors when movement occurs between lessons for secondary school and college settings

3. Reduce mixing between groups of students as much as possible

4. Social distancing and good infection prevention control amongst staff as much as possible due to the large numbers of staff who are contracting the virus.

For our school context, we have consistently maintained good infection prevention for adults and children alike: good ventilation, handwashing and regular cleaning are at the top of the list. Staff are welcome to wear face coverings. For the 14-day period following the half-term break we are holding Collective Worship in class and have split lunchtimes in the hall so that smaller groups gather at any one time. We are hopeful that following the 14 days post half term, public health advice will enable us to return to normal operations and come together once again.

Home – School – Church – Pumpkin Trail at St Mary's, Chilton Foliat

On Saturday 30th October, our local church, St Mary's in Chilton Foliat, was the venue for a Pumpkin Trail. The children used the church grounds to find answers to craftily placed quiz questions and then as the sun began to set, took a tea light candle tour which ended up by placing their candles on the font just inside the church door.

With a good turnout, our mums, dads and governors who helped organise, raised more than the previous year - $\pounds70$ in total from refreshment sales.

We have agreed to split this with $\pounds 50$ going to school and $\pounds 20$ to the church. Many thanks to all the adults who helped organise.



Out and about


