
Dear Parents and Carers

I hope it's not too late to extend my happy new year good wishes and welcome all back to school for 2022. Class letters and information about curriculum coverage have been sent out and learning for term 3 is well and truly underway. After the hustle, bustle and sparkle of Christmas and New Year celebrations, this first spring term is an opportunity to calmly focus on our learning goals and learning challenges. The children have responded incredibly well to learning expectations and good progress is being made as a result. However, we are also looking forward to several extra-curricular activities taking place in school, which are described a little later in this newsletter.

Spring Term Christian Value – **Courage**

Our spring term Christian value is **Courage** and across the school the children are exploring this value through different texts and activities. With thanks to our Open the Book Teams and Clergy, **Courage** is also being illustrated through Old Testament bible stories sharing a common theme; describing how, with God's help, women have dared to do the right thing.

Looking forward to the end of term, the bible stories shared in Collective Worship will focus on social justice and ask big questions such as "how rich countries in the world should share?" and "how we can help people who need to be set free from terrible situations and not just forget about them?". On Thursday 3rd February, the school will be enjoying a themed day "Global Neighbours Day" and celebrating the service of Christingle too. All these experiences provide a much-needed safe space for all our children to continue to make sense of the world in which they live and empower them to become active global citizens.

Bibles

In our last newsletter (December 2021) we included some photos depicting events that had taken place during the term. One lovely picture was of our year 3's and new joiners proudly holding up their new bibles. To follow up, here is an explanation of how we use our bibles in school. Bibles are handed out to every year 3 pupil and any new joiner who has started school in years 3, 4, 5 & 6. They are named and kept in either Muntjac Class or Sika Class and are used to support the teaching of scripture in and outside of RE lessons. The intention is that the children's class bible is used as a learning tool. When a piece of scripture is being discussed, the children are encouraged to find, read and refer to it as part of their learning. If a child would like to read their personal bible during a free reading session they are also able to do this. Children leaving in year 6 take their bibles with them and continue to use them as a source of reference and pleasure. Our bibles kindly donated by the Mills Trust.
