Behaviour and Anti-Bullying Approach and Policy


It is a primary aim of our school that every member of the school community feels safe, valued and respected, and that each person is treated fairly and well. We are a caring Christian community, whose values are built on mutual trust and respect for all. The school behaviour policy is therefore designed to provide the way in which all members of the school can live and work together in a supportive way. It aims to promote an environment where everyone feels happy, safe and secure.

For a large part of the summer term staff meeting schedule, the teaching team came together to review our whole school approach to behaviour management and anti-bullying. We based our discussions on a range of current evidence informed research and best practice. From these sessions we have created a new Behaviour Policy and a new Anti-Bullying Policy, which we are now able to share with the school community. Both policies are being sent out with this newsletter.

Implementation has begun and information sessions are being held with all members of staff at school including Breakfast and After School Club. The children are being involved too; their views and feedback on how the characteristics: Ready, Respectful and Safe, can be achieved, are a regular focus of class and Collective Worship conversation.

As part of the implementation process, we would welcome feedback from our families. A Parent Forum focused on the content held within the two policies, is being held on Monday 13th November at 2.00pm in the Club House and all are welcome. If you are unable to attend you are also welcome to email any comments/thoughts to admin@chiltonfoliat.wilts.sch.uk.

Once we have received further feedback, we will be revising our Home School Agreement which sets out expectations and responsibilities for our children, our parents and the school. Many thanks for your support.


The end of an era. Mrs Ody is retiring
