Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back to school for a busy last summer term at Chilton Foliat Primary School. Uniform

As the weather continues to improve the children will want to wear their lighter weight clothing such as shorts and summer dresses. We would also encourage



the wearing of school uniform summer caps. These are available for sale from the office for $\pounds4.60$ and need to be clearly labelled. Non uniform caps, such as a branded cap are not school uniform and are not acceptable.

We also have a substantial store of good quality second hand uniform and will be organizing a second hand uniform sale on **Wednesday 15th June from 3.15pm** on the play ground.

Attendance

Analysis of recent attendance data shows an increase in whole school attendance in term 4 of 93% to 96% in term 5. The increase is largely due to the dropping off of COVID-19 related illness – good news indeed. As we continue to monitor the progress, socially, emotionally and academically of all our pupils it is imperative that we consistently promote the benefits of good attendance at school. We also know that good attendance, alongside good behaviour is an integral part of our school's Christian vision and values, "With thankfulness, courage and love, we thirst to



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improve heart and mind". The Department for Education (DfE) have released a revised set of guidance, applicable from September 2022, which will drive our attendance policy and practice.

For the purposes of granting leave of absence, the guidance repeats the message that, only in exceptional circumstances may the school agree to absence in term time. This will not include holidays. With regard to attendance policy, our Local Authority provides information about the possibility of penalty notices being issued or legal proceedings taking place in the event of 10 or more sessions of absence being recorded within 6 months of the academic year.

Chilton Foliat Primary School kicked off its Platinum Jubilee celebrations with a picnic in the school grounds which raised

over £600 for the school. 


The Friends
