

Hopewell High: All Too Much

Samira wants to make her family proud and works incredibly hard at school. Her teachers also want her to do well and can see her potential.

When she becomes the youngest person ever to be asked to join the school quiz team, she feels she must accept – but she also needs to re-check her English essay and make sure her test results are up to scratch.

When the pressure gets too much, Samira has a coping strategy that has potentially serious consequences – but sees no alternative until her friends step in to help.

An absorbing look at the pressures and mental health challenges that can affect young people. Presented in a super-readable format and interspersed with line drawings, this would be ideal for struggling or reluctant readers looking for age-appropriate subject matter.

Science afternoon with Marlborough College students

Sika Class had a fantastic afternoon building rockets with students from Marlborough College, as part of our Science topic about forces. A lot of thought went into creating the designs to see which one could fly the furthest. We discussed the aerodynamics of the rocket shape and the forces used to ensure the rocket travelled far. It all became very competitive, but great fun as well. The teacher who supervised his students was impressed with the level of engagement and knowledge the children had in this area of physics. He also loved how enthusiastic they were and the attention they paid to detail to ensure the rockets were a success. Sika class had a thoroughly wonderful afternoon and one which we can hopefully repeat again in the near future.







Governor Learning Walk

Last week and as part of a wide range of monitoring activities so that school standards can be rigorously checked, three school governors joined our Local Authority School Improvement Adviser on a Learning Walk around the school. The focus of the session was to gain a sense of how well our children are engaging with their learning and how the environment and culture supported the learning process. Here is a small selection of the comments that have been shared by the governors with us:

All children were really engaged in their **love** of learning (inclusive)

They were proud of their work and excited to share

They were demonstrating **courage** in how they responded to questions, and tackled their assigned tasks with enthusiasm

The wall displays have huge amounts of content for the children to reflect on and to reinforce learning and share work

Tremendous amounts of collaboration throughout (children interacting respectfully and **thankfully** together as they engage in their work).








Wonka Chocolate Bar Winners


Book review by Fred Risdale

4 star rating.


