Statutory Data Results – KS2 SATs

After a two year COVID-19 absence, statutory assessment has returned. The school is responsible to parents, the DfE and the Local Authority to report attainment data for key milestones: EYFS Profile outcomes; phonics; KS1 SATs (year 2), Multiplication Timestable Check (year 4) and KS2 SATs (year 6). All, but the KS2 results, are undergoing a quality assurance check with the relevant authorities and we will be reporting to parents in reception, year 2 and year 4 very shortly. The KS2 SATs results have been shared with our year 6 children and their parents. With Mrs Pinnegar's permission, I would like to share the words she wrote to our Year 6 pupils and their families on results day.

"I would like to take this opportunity to express my unrelenting pride with the Year 6 pupils this year. They have worked incredibly hard with all their learning, including preparation for SATs, and have had to overcome many hurdles over the last few years to achieve the successes of today. Their continued resilience and support of one another has been the foundation of their achievements, and I feel incredibly lucky to have been a small part of the journey so far. I know Mrs Armstrong and the rest of the staff feel the same. Monday 11th July at 9.15am – Collective Worship – Welcome to our themed week of Service

A special Collective Worship will be led by Rev.Beth Hutton. Just as Jesus and the Queen were anointed to signify the beginning of their journey of service, Rev.Beth will be offering to anoint the children as they begin their journey of service as part of themed week. This will take the form of the sign of the cross on their hand (using holy oil) and is purely optional. Parents and carers are invited to express an interest in attending (so that we can manage numbers) to this special Collective Worship and come and be anointed too. This will signify the continuation of your journey as supportive parents, nurturing and nourishing your children as they **thirst for knowledge** and **strive to improve heart and mind**.

Monday 11th July at 1.00pm – The Shelburne Ensemble – Service in action

Our children will have the opportunity to receive an act of service via the medium of music. The Shelburne Ensemble is made up of five local professional musicians, all highly experienced performers and teachers, having worked with a variety of professional orchestras. They share a passion for ensuring that high quality music making is accessible to all and have come together with the aim of bringing live music to the children in our local area. Instruments involved are the violin, cello, French horn, percussion and voice. The ensemble have experience of education and outreach projects throughout the UK and enjoy being involved in music making closer to home. These talented musicians will serve our children with:

- An opportunity to experience the excitement of a performance by musicians in front of an audience.
- The inspiration to begin or continue with their music making, both singing and playing an instrument
 - The offer of participating in music making as an audience.

Wednesday 13th July at 2.00pm – A concert and service of afternoon tea for members of our local community

We are personally inviting our local community to come and join us for a concert of singing and music performed by the choir and the whole school. The songs will reflect the theme of service, some well-known and some new. After the concert, our older children will be serving tea and cake for our guests.



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Thursday 14th July at 2.00pm – Children's Fete and Open Afternoon

The great news is that the children have truly embraced the theme for our special week, service and are busy preparing their stalls for the children's fete. As you know, we have also been selling raffle tickets online and in person for the raffle which will also be drawn at the fete. The momentum is building and the children are very excited.

All proceeds will be donated to our chosen international charity UNICEF and in support and service of the children of Ukraine.



As well as the children's fete, parents are also welcome to take a tour of their child's classroom. You will be able to look at the displays, reflection books and photographs to see how the year has unfolded. This is particularly so for Roe Class parents who would have recently received their child's annual report.
