









The River Kennet, which we know so well is the symbol of how we can make our journey.










• We are the fish who live in the river, swimming in the same direction, as we continue on our journey.

• This the bridge that represents our governors who look over both sides of the river, backwards and forwards, to help plan our future at school.







With thankfulness, courage and love, we strive to improve heart and mind."


